An old standby on the Miramichi from which several variations have emerged, substituting florescent floss for the tag and the butt. This combination of shiny copper tinsel, bright orange hackle and red and green floss is attractive to angler and salmon alike. The Copper Killer is a particularly a good fall pattern in small sizes and often effective in larger sizes during high water in the spring.
